Lady Liberty's torch is a symbol of enlightenment. It lights the way to freedom and down the path of liberty. The official title of the Statue of Liberty is actually "Liberty Enlightening the World."

The Statue of Liberty primarily symbolizes freedom and democracy. It was conceived as a gift from France to the United States in 1876 to commemorate the centennial of the American Declaration of Independence, the liberation of American slaves, and the enduring friendship between the two nations. Beyond its initial purpose, the Statue has become a universal symbol of hope, opportunity, and the fight for liberty, particularly for immigrants seeking a better life. There is a sonnet chiseled into her base which reads in part, "Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breathe free." This excerpt from the Emma Lazarus poem "The New Colossus" defines the foundational American spirit, welcoming those from other lands to come and build a stronger United States.

actions of our current Trump regime. The delegates to the Second Continental Congress wrote, **"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among those are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of**

happiness." The authors rejected the very idea of a king. They said if those rights are threatened it is the right and duty of the people to throw off such a government.

The delegates listed 27 ways that King George III was destroying their liberties and violating their rights. Among those— in modern language—the king Ignored the rule of law Suppressed the vote Stopped immigration Militarized communities Cut off trade with the rest of the world Deprived people of due process and trial by jury Deported people to other countries

Dissolving Plastic

Restoration Projects

China: Through its "Beautiful Rivers and Lakes" program, China has restored over 200 river and lake ecosystems, improving water quality and reviving aquatic life. The initiative includes rewilding riverbanks, tackling non-point pollution (from farms and urban runoff), and promoting naturebased solutions in urban and rural areas alike. <u>Read more here.</u>

Europe: Last year Europe dismantled 542 dams, weirs, culverts, and sluices, aiding river restoration and biodiversity. This is an 11% increase from 2023, and involved 23 countries, with Finland, France, and Spain leading the way. <u>Here's the article.</u>
